10-Minute Talk: Jim Duggan The Big Bang and its Aftermath







Educated at the University of Cambridge, David Rand joined the CSIRO in Melbourne in 1969. As Chief Research Scientist, he was the CSIRO's scientific advisor on hydrogen and renewable energy until his retirement in 2008. During his distinguished career, David has been awarded the Faraday Medal by the Royal Society of Chemistry(UK) IN 1991, the UNESCO Gaston Plante Medal by the Bulgarian Academy of Sciences in 1996 and the RH Stokes Medal by the Royal Australian Chemical Institute in 2006. He became a Member of the Order of Australia in 2013. Currently, Chief Energy Scientist for the Solar Car Challenge.



Mayhem to Mounting Yards

John Bushby Any presentation with a title that includes mayhem and mounting yards is bound to attract our attention. Our May Keynote Speaker, Sal Perna, Victoria's Racing Integrity Commissioner, clearly exceeded our members' expectations with his interesting and professional presentation. After twenty years as a member of Victoria Police, including experience in diverse investigations ranging from murders through the mayhem of the Russell Street bombing and the Walsh Street assassinations – not to mention a few autopsy attendances - Sal finished his career with a heightened sense of reality, complementing his many successes as a Detective Inspector.

His move to Australia Post in 1992 caused him to adapt his methods of investigation to the needs of a more corporate environment. As Auspost handled 19 million postal articles per day, he had to deal with a wide range of bizarre items that people tried to post (eg 'anthrax' powder, baboon heads, dead ducks, frogs, pythons and letter bombs), after which he moved to Telstra and a program of dealing with physical and virulent threats in the virtual world. A renowned authority on organisational risk by now, Sal founded Calibre International, a consultancy dealing with all forms of management and risk. As if this was not enough, in 2010 he was appointed the first Racing Integrity Commissioner, working closely with racing industry-controlling bodies in Victoria. Suffice to say that his work has 'had its moments' with the colourful characters and obscure practices that are said to have bedevilled the racing industry in the past. None of our members doubt that Sal is the right man to handle the needs of this industry. Thanks to Sal for a gold-plated presentation. MORE
