The tranquil Gippsland Lakes - the largest inland network of waterways in Australia - are a system of coastal lagoons separated from the Tasman Sea by the coastal dunes of the Ninety Mile Beach. The lake system covers an area of about 354 km2. Seven rivers terminate at the lakes - the Latrobe, Avon, Tambo, Nicholson, Mitchell, Macalister and Thomson rivers. There are approximately 400 indigenous flora species and 300 native fauna species. Three plants, two of them orchids, are listed as endangered. The lakes are home to about 50 of the recently described species of Bottlenose Dolphin.



Tears To Our Eyes

Local oncologist and surgeon David Dangerfield Williamstown Ride (above) specialises in men's health problems, with which many members are familiar kidney, bladder and prostate procedures. One slide showing the facial expression of a patient enduring a digital rectal examination brought tears to many eyes. David said that at least 50% of men over 40 years of age can expect some problems related to an enlarged prostate gland, including weak urine flow and waking three or more times a night to pass urine, sleep deprivation being one side effect. He recommends PSA blood tests annually together with digital rectal examinations for men under 75 to detect early signs of prostate cancer. David spoke of great improvements in surgery techniques and treatments that have extended the life expectancy of patients but emphasised that early diagnosis is important. The volume of questions from the floor was a measure of the interest his excellent address aroused.
