All the Tea in China

Of course, many of us knew that Ceylon (Sri Lanka) wasn't the first place to grow tea - but we may not have realised that, in fact, it was first grown in China about 3000 BC, a variant of the camelia plant. From there it gradually found its way as far afield as India along a sea-route which rivalled the Silk Road. Not surprisingly, during the 15th and 16th centuries, a few European adventurers (especially Portuguese maritime explorers including Dias and Da Gama) were excited by what they found when they sailed around the Cape of Good Hope and beyond to India and Ceylon, bringing home novel commodities such as tea and exotic spices. Many centuries later, Stan Phillips, followed their path aboard a modern cruise liner: via the Maldives, Seychelles, Reunion Island (famous for the vanilla plant), Mauritius, ports in South Africa, Angola, Cape Verde, Tangiers and Malaga, Spain. By Stan's colourful account (with pictures), it was a rewarding experience worthy of its historic significance. Ed.

The lunches being provided by our new caterer are proving popular but the importance of the sign-in sheet showing who is staying for lunch cannot be over-emphasised. At our last meeting, for example, five more members stayed for lunch than advised - a result of members signing the sheet during morning tea but not advising me - which did not become apparent until everyone had been seated, causing some concern for the caterers. However, to their credit, they were able to adjust for the extras. This may not always be the case. It is very pleasing that more members are staying for lunch but it is very important to indicate this when signing in.

NOTE: As a result of recent discussions with our caterer, in order to maintain the high standard of meals we have received in the past few months, the cost of lunch will revert to \$30 per head as from our January meeting.

New Kind of Learning

Our November Keynote Speaker, Debby Chavers, Principal of Beaumaris Secondary College, painted an optimistic scenario of a modern brand-new school with amazing learning spaces and grounds that will service the local community in the years ahead and share its facilities with others as much as possible. She spoke about her school as having a highly-engaged parent community with all staff and students committed to the core values of curiosity, optimism, respect and excellence; a school like no other, she said. Above all, students have to learn that the way you treat others is the way you get treated yourself.

"I think schools are mini-worlds," Debby said, "a place of high expectations, learning to contribute to the world they will enter." Also, a place where key words 'investigate', 'generate', 'plan and manage', 'produce', 'evaluate' and 'communicate' become the touchstone to success. But the cohort of 60 per cent boys and 40 per cent girls has some other special features of which she is proud: their engagement with the natural environment in the local area - and the fact that more than 200 ride their bike to and from school, harking back to the days when everybody went to their local school, she says. Also, Beaumaris has students on the School Council and students engaged in constructing the curriculum, innovations that reflect a new kind of learning and a new approach to schooling in a modern world.
