

"Adventures many and varied.."

A Remarkable Man

Dick Smith is probably known to most Australians as a philanthropist but perhaps most as someone who has always been off somewhere on a great adventure.

He started his remarkable business career installing car radios in 1960. He became so adept at it he was told by his boss that he was working too quickly and instead of taking only two hours to install a radio he should be taking three hours. He then started his own business in a small shed on a busy road and that quickly blossomed. He moved to bigger and better premises and was well on the way to making his first of many millions.

Along the way, he moved into selling spare parts and then into electronic parts and he became known as Electronic Dick and then Dick Smith Electronics was born. His business was so successful that he soon found that he had enough money to go off and do the adventures he had dreamed of doing.

Dick was very good at listening to others' advice and selecting those who worked for him. This allowed him to leave the running of his expanding business to others while he was concentrating on things that were of more interest to him. Dick Smith Electronics eventually expanded to 350 stores Australia-wide.

His adventures were many and varied and involved his whole family, of which his wife Pip was probably his greatest supporter. Some of his adventures were not always well-thought out and he nearly lost his life and that of two friends when they continued a trek along the Colo River when the weather turned against them. His first attempt to climb Ball's Pyramid near Lord Howe Island failed and it took another two attempts to achieve success - and he was the first to do so.

Dick is probably most famous for the many solo flights in his helicopter and fixed-wing plane to various parts of the world. He has flown around the world solo three times including from pole to pole. He crossed Australia by balloon and then from New Zealand to Australia against the prevailing winds. The book goes into considerable detail regarding each of his exploits and the reader never ceases to be amazed by them. This is a most interesting read and inspires emotions in the reader at the achievements of this most remarkable man. He had donated much of his fortune to various projects in Australia as well as founding the Australian Geographic Society which publishes *Australian Geographic*. Geoff Wade

The Last Word





Since he was very young, Rick Kelly has had an ambition to go to Antarctica, however, it was some decades before he had the opportunity to fulfil his dream. He grabbed it with both hands and found himself on an excursion aboard a Russian ship with 100-plus others to visit the famous Mawson's Hut from December 2005 to January 2006. Leaving from Hobart, their first stop was Macquarie Island where Rick was able to engage in his passion for photography because he found himself surrounded by ice and snow and penguins and elephant seals. Rick entertained us with dozens of photographs of the icy wastes and local wildlife. What amazed him most was how inquisitive penguins are; but, in turn, visitors are discouraged from making contact with them.

Next stop: Commonwealth Bay and Mawson's Hut (90 years old but still standing amidst the snow and ice). Built by a group of 18 scientists with few trade skills, the hut is a slap-dash construction with few amenities and showing all the signs of a need for repairs as the elements work their way inside

through cracks and the damages of time. Yet a collection of *National Geographic* from 100 years ago remained intact. Rick discovered that this was probably the windiest place on Earth (blowing at upwards of 150 km most of the time) and was surrounded by icebergs and was also the home of hundreds of penguins of many different types: from Gentoo, Adele to Royal Penguins. He also found that penguins only enter the water in groups, largely because of the dangers that may lurk beneath the surface. "They know there is safety in numbers," he said.

While the South Pole was too far away, by walking across the icefloe, the group managed to reach the Magnetic South Pole marking a quite significant achievement for this recent expedition. Peter McGregor
