



Pierre Bonnard is one the most loved painters of the 20th century, celebrated for his use of colour to convey an exquisite sense of emotion. His close friend Henri Matisse declared that Bonnard was "a great painter, for today and definitely for the future". The exhibition features more than 100 works by Bonnard presented within a contemporary scenography by India Madavi.

Chris Renwick - Keynote Speaker Tuesday 16 May

Chris Renwick gave a speech on The Great War. He focused particularly on the social and political impacts of the war on the nation and the character and qualities of the Australian soldier.

Chris detailed the statistics that approximately 40% of all males in the age range of 18-44 volunteered,

some 420,000 of whom, 330,000 served overseas. 62,000 were killed in action or died of wounds. Total Australian casualties were 65% of the 330,000, considerably higher than the casualty percentage in the UK, NZ and Canadian forces.

The problem of insufficient reinforcements, leading to the failed Conscription referenda of 1916 and 1917 were covered, as was the subsequent impact to the Australian armies of WW2.

Chris discussed the impact of the loss of manpower on the Western District and the town of Geelong as an example of what happened all around the country.





The topic of the "discipline" of the Australian soldier was canvassed, as was his considerable fighting qualities.
