For example, I was alerted to a possible visit to this year's Archibald Prize finalists exhibition in Mornington, and good guest speaker recommendations.

Our guest speaker this month is Richard Royle, another friend of mine from Metropolitan Golf Club, and his topic is Digital Health. Richard has over 30 years of senior executive experience in the public, for profit and not for profit private hospital sectors in Australia, plus experience as a senior executive with one of the major Australian private health insurers. He also spent time as PwC's lead partner for digital health in Australia and SE Asia. Richard oversaw the successful implementation of Australia's first fully integrated digital hospital in Hervey Bay, as group CEO of Uniting Care Health in 2014. In 2016, he was asked to be the startup CEO of the newly established Australian Digital Health Agency - putting into practice one of his recommendations from a landmark review he was asked to lead in 2013 for the Federal Government on digital health in Australia. He currently chairs the CSIRO's eHealth Research Centre, which has a national footprint and has successfully commercialized several innovative digital health initiatives. Unlike the inimitable Peter Jones last month, he is happy for us to video his presentation!



Guest Speakers

Peter Jones - 'Special Events under the Spotlight'



It was a pleasure to have Peter Jones as our guest speaker at our August General Meeting. Peter shared some of his perceptions and experiences gained through organising significant events for more than 33 years. Through his company, Peter Jones Special Events, he has been involved in hundreds and hundreds of Australia's major events.

Peter candidly spoke about many of the celebrities and politicians he has encountered; he gave us his personal assessment of many of them - in so doing he invoked the 'Chatham House Rule' and consequently his discourse was not filmed for our Guest Speaker archive. Peter said most of those he met were 'really nice' - of politicians he said he was not biased and 'bags both sides', but that is not to say he didn't have anything positive to say of some of them!

In all I counted more than 20 celebrities/politicians/royalty mentioned. Peter talked about the following folks to varying degrees (listed in no particular order or regard for protocol): Meat Loaf (Michael Lee Aday) AFL GF controversy, Tiger Woods affair, Neale Daniher, John Travolta Qantas, Oprah Winfrey, Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth, Mary Crown Princess of Denmark, Shane Warne Memorial, Kevin Rudd, Julie Bishop, Malcolm Turnbull, John Brumby, Ted Baillieu, Julia Gillard, Robbie Williams, Lionel Richie, John Farnham, Eddie McGuire, Ed Sheeran, Diana Ross, The Beach Boys, Luciano Pavarotti and Cadel Evans.

Peter spoke movingly of Neale Daniher and his amazing efforts to raise funds for overcoming Motor Neurone Disease (MND). Peter told us Neale's endeavours have raised more than \$74 million. Neale wanted an inspirational event at the MCG - he rejected the iced water bucket tipped over a celebrity idea as not big enough. Neale's initial concept was spectacular, but not practical - Peter explained it was, however, the catalyst for a collaboration culminating in the institution that is the Big Freeze. Paying homage to Neale's drive and vision, Peter told us Neale has realised his goal of creating an enduring legacy.

Peter engaged us with many interesting insights into large event management - facts and observations derived from his stimulating and challenging career. It is no wonder Peter is a go to option when a large event needs execution with the utmost professionalism.
