Both show a small deficit mainly due to the one-off items of upgrading the website and the IT projection equipment. We remain in a financially sound position with a cash buffer of over \$6K. Despite increased costs and inflation, the annual membership fee will remain unchanged. Sad to report that Ian Martin has passed away aged 87, having been an esteemed member for nine years. The Committee sadly accepted the resignation of Bruce Tomkins for personal reasons. Bruce, together with Alan Farmer, was instrumental in the formation of the Bridge Group.

On a rainy day with nothing else to do, Rod Murrell analysed our membership profile. Unsurprisingly our average age is 82. More interesting is that only 38% live in Beaumaris and Black Rock. Is the "tyranny of distance" (Geoffrey Blainey) reducing the average attendance at our monthly meetings to around 50%? Or is it the declining health/mobility of members in the higher age brackets? Many able members can provide transport - you only have to ask!

Our guest speaker last month was Don Riddington, and the topic was his English Channel swim. In 2013 at the age of 68, Don was the oldest Australian and third oldest worldwide to achieve this. We were impressed with his huge mental and physical stamina. (see report p7)

In particular it is the story of Australia's first fighter squadron of Kittyhawks defending against the Japanese advances. 
The cost for this special fine dining event at the Melbourne Club is \$140.00pp Maximum 60 Members and partners.

Channel Champ

As you do (perhaps), Don Riddington took up swimming in his 50s, eventually becoming the oldest Australian and the third oldest person ever to swim the English Channel ten years ago at the age of 68. After three years' practice - mainly around the Brighton marina - in water temperature of 16 degrees, Don was ready to tackle the 33 km gruelling task (the equivalent of Black Rock to Tullamarine or 400 laps of an Olympic-sized pool). As he described it, he was looking for "something more exciting than accounting." A diagram of his swim illustrated how, rather than in a straight line from Dover to the French coast, the strong tides of 5-8 km forced him to swim a giant 'S' at 2-3 km an hour, probably a distance of twice 'as the crow flies' in just more than 19 hours. The duration of the swim was the equivalent of lasting from lunchtime to breakfast next morning, in a water temperature of 14 degrees and 5m bow waves, being fed every 30 minutes from the accompanying boat with an experienced pilot on board (@ £3600). Importantly, the strict rules of the swim demand that he never touch the boat or another person.

In his view, the main ingredients of success were focus and determination, concentrating the whole time on his next feed, rather than the distance yet to be travelled. As the wind picked up, it meant swimming at 48 strokes per minute for 16 hours. To strengthen his resolve, he kept in mind the wisdom of his mother who forbade him from ever mentioning the words 'cold' or 'pain'. Fortunately, the entire swim was captured on video, showing him struggling in choppy waters and, eventually, staggering up the French beach and being greeted by friends and supporters. Amazingly, in recent weeks, Don was invited back to swim the Channel again as part of a small relay team - which he completed successfully.

Bill Dedicoat's life ran somewhat in parallel to the life of Queen Victoria, but, sadly, he lived at the other end of the social spectrum, being subjected to frequent beating, lashes and imprisonment, both in England in his youth and in Australia after he was transported to Van Diemen's Land. Our 10-minute speaker, Leon Laragy, gave an entertaining portrait of a young, uneducated man who constantly found himself at the butt of the justice system in the 19th century. He witnessed daily horrors, such as the bull-baiting, cock-fighting, bare-knuckle fighting, murder and animal barbarity that was commonplace at that time in the UK, always finding his way into trouble of one sort or another, resulting in him having to run away from the various masters to whom he was assigned. Eventually, arrested for stealing a waistcoat he had innocently been asked to look after, he was sentenced to transportation for 10 years in 1839, living the rest of his life in Australia where he often experienced 100 lashes on the triangle and drifted into a career of bushranging. A sad tale of someone who never had a chance in life.
