

## **Guest Speakers**

### Australia Fights Back

Horn Island is a small island only metres from Thursday Island on the fringe of Cape York Peninsula and was the subject of **Ian Marchment's** comprehensive keynote address (including maps) at the November meeting. This insignificant little island was a major Allied airbase during the Second World War - known as Horn Island Aerodrome - which was constructed prior to the war and attacked several times by Japanese planes. In fact, it was bombed eight times, second only to Darwin. Little-known at the time, it was Australia's last line of defence but housed the 75<sup>th</sup> Fighter Squadron, a mere 440 km south of Port Moresby, made up of 75 Kitty Hawks the RAAF had somehow managed to acquire from Sydney. In 1939, Australia had sent 1000 men to the UK for 10 days' pilot training, many without any background in flying: they were anything from crop dusters to maintenance mechanics to accountants, with little or no experience in the military.

An exceptional leader, John Francis Jackson, was appointed Squadron Leader, tasked with taking this inexperienced group of diehards to Port Moresby for active service, where conditions at the nearby Seven Mile Airstrip were dire - leeches, malaria and dengue fever were the least of their problems. Though sleeping and eating under the wing of their plane and doing the necessary mechanical servicing at night after the plane had cooled down, this rugged group of Aussies - who did not have to wear uniforms or salute (but were required to grow moustaches) - relentlessly attacked Japanese planes across PNG and were instrumental in turning the course of the war against the Japanese. Of the pilots, 37 served, 11 were lost with only three serviceable aircraft left at the end of the 44 day period.

lan's interest in the saga was generated from his father, David, who served in the RAAF on Horn Island for 18 months.

Derek Skues, our 10-minute speaker for November, gave us a comprehensive review of his time in Saudi Arabia

some 40 years ago. "A very different place today," he said, "having tripled its population to 36 million and the capital, Riyadh, having grown from one to eight million people." In 1982, he accepted an appointment as Chief Architect for the Bureau for the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Diplomatic Quarter overseeing the development of community buildings, flanked by more than 80 embassies with associated housing around the perimeter. It included government offices, sporting and diplomatic clubs, schools, kindergartens, mosques and a fire station. One of his proudest moments was participating in a Diplomatic Quarter Tennis Team from a number of countries and competing against German, French and Filipino teams.



He has promised us a fuller picture of his colourful life in Saudi Arabia at a later date.
