# **Guest Speakers**

#### All You Ever Wanted to Know About Art Deco

Our resident walking encyclopaedia, **Lloyd Jenkins**, gave us a tour de force on the subject of Art Deco at our January meeting. We have all heard the term but probably didn't realise what it actually meant - until Lloyd cleared up any confusion on the subject. "Art Deco refers to a period of fashion," he told us. "Fashion in a whole range of things and, in particular, the period between the two World Wars– the 20s and 30s." The term was invented, he said, by an American journalist in 1968. But



Lloyd's main focus was on house styles and the two design styles that were most fashionable at the time: the Californian Bungalow and the Streamlined style, or Ultra Modern. In a series of carefully-selected photographs - some in our area and others from books - Lloyd showed us the key design features of, for example, the Californian Bungalow: the front verandah with its heavy construction and strong pillars. The house itself has no timber skeleton, but outside walls built in double brick with a cavity in-between. We even learnt about 'tapestry bricks', popular for internal fireplaces but sometimes used by builders for external trim work to add a decorative touch. The other form of California Bungalow, dating back to 1935, was a timber version in which the roof is carried by a timber skeleton frame and the outside cladding is horizontal timber boards, the weatherboard house (which some of us grew up in!!) From houses, Lloyd moved to furniture, household appliances such as toasters, ice-chests and even a cigar-cutter. It was a colourful history lesson with a difference.



#### Adventurous Route to Hobart

Without doubt, **Tom Glass** is one of our most adventurous yachties. Not for him the comfort of the celebrity Sydney to Hobart; his 'thing' is the West Coaster from Melbourne to Hobart, 435 nautical miles in the Roaring 40s and long ocean swells. As he says, "Nowhere to run, nowhere to hide." Organised by the Ocean Racing Club of Victoria, it is an amazing challenge to the 15 - 16 yachts and crew, with a spirit and camaraderie not often seen in serious races. Not for the faint-hearted,

there are no maxis amongst this lot (nor fat wallets!). Just after Christmas, the yachts assemble adjacent to the Portsea Pier before heading for the Derwent via Maria Island and Storm Bay in a race for glory. Tom illustrated his excellent 10-minutes with a series of well-coordinated pictures.
