

# **Guest Speakers**

## When Things Go Wrong

Hospital emergency doctor, James Taylor, gave members the full treatment on the work of emergency departments in major hospitals. Not every hospital has such a facility, but in his wide experience in the Bayside area, emergency doctors in general do a wonderful job catering for the needs of the diverse range of patients they assess - all of whom present as a result of unplanned or unexpected circumstances. The task of medical staff, he says, is to make the right connection for those who walk in, are delivered by ambulance or are brought in by family or friends.

Dr Taylor asserted that the first port of call for any patient is triage, of which Victoria has one of the most complicated systems. It is all about resource allocation, he said, and creating the greatest good for the greatest number. The first thing to assess is whether action is required immediately (that is, now), or whether treatment is needed urgently (within 10 minutes), semi-urgently (30 minutes), less urgently (one hour) or not urgent at all (two hours). This takes time with skilled staff because when a patient presents wanting to see a doctor asap, this could mean referral to a nurse practitioner, an ED nurse and/or doctor, a GP clinic, a physiotherapist or being admitted as an outpatient. A patient's reasons might be that they want treatment, a clinical assessment and examination, initial treatment (to alleviate pain, for example), further investigation or a diagnosis. As a result, they may be admitted or discharged. Decisions on admissions could depend on the availability of a resuscitation bay, a general care cubicle, an isolation room, a procedure room or a short stay unit, or even the need for further tests. Decisions, decisions.
