Does anyone have USB connected external floppy drive for reading 3.5" disks or an external drive for reading DVD data files they could lend Committee?





Guest Speakers

Revolutionary naval ship

(John Rogers)

Who in Bayside has not seen the wreck of the good ship Cerberus and wondered about her? In a fascinating illustrated address, John gave us an historian's account of the ship's service to the Colony of Victoria, from the 1850's to her demise as a breakwater at Half Moon Bay. HMVS Cerberus is the only surviving example of this type of vessel in the world, and the only remnant of Australia's pre-federation colonial navies. At the time of the gold rush Russian warships shadowed our coast (much as Chinese warships have done recently). Those in authority evidently believed the rich goldfields were at risk of invasion. The government response was to reinforce its infant Navy by acquiring a revolutionary twin screw, steam driven iron clad gunship that signalled the end of the era of wood and sail. My wife's family has a connection to Cerberus in the form of a finely crafted table claimed to have been made from teak wood salvaged from the gunpowder magazine after the ship was decommissioned. The table came into her family as a wedding gift. The gunpowder magazine room was entirely lined with wood and only bronze tools were permitted to obviate the risk of a spark igniting the powder (with obviously disastrous consequences) should a clumsy sailor drop a spanner. These days the Cerberus is in danger of disappearing beneath the waves as time and corrosion take their toll. We are privileged to have possibly a last chance to pay her our respects.

The highs and lows in Peter's talk added a note of reality to what is otherwise a common fantasy.
